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Schweer's "Lockerroom Talk"

The St. Charles North Athletic Program has been moving forward in leaps and bounds over the past few weeks. If you haven't had a chance to view the new construction, it is really quite a site. . . sight to see. It seems like only a few weeks ago that you needed a set of blue prints to help visualize how all the facilities might appear in the future, and now even the most "imagination challenged" of us can get a real feel for what the final building will look like. The first of many roof trusses was set last week in the Main Gym, while the pool walls have grown from ground level to "topping out". An interesting development considering they have yet to start digging the pool basin. Locker rooms, weight rooms, team rooms, and training room all seem to be well underway. Outside site development has yet to begin as the entire area must first be leveled and graded prior to seeding, which is scheduled for the beginning of May. Personally, I can relate to the farmers as I hope for a great "growing" season.

The first of over 60 coaching positions were filled over the last few weeks, with nine Lead Coaches named. 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STC North High School PTO Update

Spring is here and blooming with news from the North High School PTO! Our first general PTO meeting was held on January 13th at Wredling School with a wonderful attendance of over 75 parents. Frank Kesman reviewed the progress of the school and how to get involved with the new PTO.

The Advisory and the Nominating Committee are currently in the process of contacting those who have signed up to volunteer on a committee at the January meeting. Plans for the opening activities and events are still being worked on. We are looking forward to meet at the next general PTO meeting to further discuss those plans. *The next general meeting is scheduled for Thursday, April 13th, 7:00 p.m., in the LRC at Wredling School*. There will also be a general meeting on Thursday, May 11th, 7:00 p.m., in the Wredling LRC.

More volunteers are still needed and will be able to sign up for committees that evening. We will also be presenting a proposed slate of officers and the by-laws for the new PTO the same evening. The vote to approve the slate of officers and by-laws will be at the first official PTO meeting in September.

We would like to thank those who have volunteered their time and look forward to the continued support.

The Student Activity Program, under the leadership of Debbie Kling, is beginning to develop an identity of its own. On three occasions, Mrs. Kling has solicited student input (8th and 9th grade students) in order to be able to prioritize our student needs and interests. To that end, a number of activity sponsors have stepped forward and will be recommended for approval to sponsor a variety of clubs and organizations. In addition, we are working to develop transition activities for Peer Leadership, Student Government, and Natural Leaders. These are just three of the key programs being established to bring leadership opportunities to our students next year. Support and encouragement from East High School in these areas will help us considerably as we develop our own program.

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Construction Update

As might be expected, construction on our facility continues on an uneven basis with the changing weather conditions of early spring impacting exterior work. Our latest success has been the installation of steel bow-truss work on the natatorium and main contest gym areas. These steel trusses will form the shell of the roof work to follow. Completion of this work is critical to the continuation of interior work in the athletic area.

Currently, we have established an early May timeline for grading, topsoil, and seeding. As we are uncertain regarding how well the outside areas will progress during this growing season, our Athletic Director, Mr. Tom Schweer, has contacted the Norris Center and the Park District regarding our fall athletic needs and how we might be able to work together. Their response has been positive.

Now that the bow trusses have been "set", the walls of the athletic facility will be completed and masonry work will begin to finalize interior walls in the fine arts area. The front wall of the auditorium, which creates the lobby area will follow the interior work scheduled to begin the week of April 10th.

We are far enough along in the one-story academic additions so that interior painting has been started. Much of the additional academic space cannot be seen at all from Route 31 and is under-appreciated when viewed from Red Gate Road. Twenty-six additional classrooms, a Technology Center, and a digital art facility make up most of the academic addition. Access for students will be along two major corridors, and the entire area surrounds a courtyard available for student and staff access.

LOGO-SELECTION

The process is underway to identify the "logo" for St. Charles North High School. During the month of March, 8th and 9th grade students, staff, and parents were invited to submit a "graphic" that would represent the essence of "North Stars" and capture the spirit of our new high school. Reflecting pride and excellence in all aspects of our school community is one of the key criteria that will be used to determine the final selections. The next step during the first two weeks in April will involve North High School Staff as they narrow the field of submissions down to the final four.

During the third week in April, displays in the North Building at St. Charles High School and both Wredling and Thompson Middle Schools will showcase the final four customized "logos". Following the same methods used to determine the school colors and school mascot this past fall, 8th and 9th grade students who will be attending SCNHS will have the opportunity to once again rank order choices to determine the graphic representation for our new "North Stars" symbol. Working collaboratively together, students, staff and parents should have a new logo for display by the end of this month.

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STAFFING UPDATE

Now that student course tallies are complete we are able to finalize the identification of staff to be assigned to North High School. Although fewer in numbers, a second list of faculty to move to North High School will soon be published, joining those staff members already identified as the first faculty of our new high school. We hope to complete this transition process for current staff members by April 14th, allowing us to identify the remaining vacancies for next year's staff positions.

In addition, non-certified support staff transferring to North High School have also been identified. Additional positions will be posted at both high schools as a result of the transfer process. Maintenance and custodial plans are also under way. A tentative list of necessary staff will be reviewed as part of the budget process. Once staffing levels are finalized, we will begin the process of interviewing and assignment.
